Through the course of the year, a full three quarters of our membership participated in at least one club event. While you may wonder why 25 percent of our members would pay dues but not attend any events, a 75 percent participate rate actually stacks up well when you compare it to other clubs around the country.

We also racked up about 2 hours of community service for each member on our roster. Admittedly, that work was done by a much smaller number of members. Too few of us have experienced the sense of satisfaction that comes with taking just a few hours each quarter to beautify our two sections of adopted highway or prepare a hot meal at SERVE.

Administratively, if you can use that term with our club, much of the focus over the past year has been to get more people involved in the club's operations. Not only do we want to prevent burnout from having one or two members do nearly all the club's work but we also want to have as many people involved in the club's leadership as possible.

This year we want to continue that effort by improving communication, both among those taking on those tasks and the membership at large. Reviving the newsletter will help with that effort. We also will be having more frequent Helm Committee meetings so we can get more done in face-to-face meetings and less by flurries of emails.

We already have a lot of events planned for 2012, plenty of opportunities for you to spend more time with the 75 percent and get the most out of your membership investment. Also, there is always room in the calendar to add something that you might want to do—if this club isn't doing the type of events you want it is only because you haven't made the plan.


